Questions for facilitating dynamic discussion

In The Beginning Week 3: Is Work Bad? Genesis 2:1-20 September 22,2024 Jeff Griffin

Join us in the time machine and let's go back to the beginning of everything. In the first chapters of Genesis, we are blessed with a description of the creation of the universe and the origination of humanity. This week, let's discuss how the ancient days will enable us to thrive in the present in light of the work we do.

Kicking It Off:

In honor of this week's message about work, what has been your most unusual job? What would you consider your favorite?

Discussion:

- 1. Jeff mentioned how 25 million Europeans came to America in order to get work in the early 1900s. Have you or a family member ever moved "far away" for a new job? Please share your experience. What type of work could ever lure you away from where you live now?
- 2. Jeff shared how God wants people to use their skills and energies on meaningful labor. What thoughts come to mind when you hear that work is a *gift* from God? What's your take on work being found in the garden of Eden, even before sin ever entered the world? Does that surprise you? (And why or why not?)
